Martin Hanselmann's work argues with Dulichenko's already obsolete terminology for Slavic "micro-languages" and considers that it needs to be reworked, although it continues to use its terms; adds scientific value to the thesis of the specificity of the Balkan languages which, due to their complex historical destiny, have several regional forms; tries to propose a new concept for the existence of so-called micro-languages and examines nine micro-linguistic criteria.
